
REFLECTING ON GOD'S WORD FOR THIS SUNDAY...

Readings: Joel 2.23-32 - Ps 65 - 2 Timothy 4.6-8, 16-18 - Gospel Luke 18.15-30

Our Gospel reading from the Lectionary combines two seemingly unrelated passages, both in their own right very well known. Luke 18:15-17 "Jesus blesses little children" and Luke 18: 18-30 "The rich young ruler". The problem with passages from scripture that are so well known is that we can miss the power they have to change our

perception of how we think things should be in our world.

Jesus blessing the children is a case in piont. Even the disciples are having trouble realising that literally everybody has access to the Kingdom, even those on the margins of society. They do wrong then, when like 'minders' they shew away people who bring along their infants for Jesus to touch. It is to "such as these" that the Kingdom of God belongs.



Jesus makes a further point: whoever does not receive the Kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it. The point is that a child has no capacity to earn or pay for what it needs. A child receives everything as pure gift, it has nothing to give in response, except affection and love. Such is the case with the Kingdom. God's unmerited, an earnable gift, calls simply for a response of grateful love. Jesus' welcome of the children and they being receptive to him is the perfect welcome extend it to all in the hospitality of God. *Blessings, Fr Ron.*

MOTHER'S UNION AUSTRALIA – THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK Sunday 19th October 2025 – "The New Creation"

"Therefore if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: the old has gone the new is here!"
(2 Corinthians 5:17)

Jesus preached the coming kingdom of God. In his death, resurrection and ascension the kingdom arrived. It is not here in its fullness yet, as sin and evil still exist and even we who are new creations in him are not free from sin. But we can see the power of the new creation at work in the way in which Christians care for those around them, not least the most lowly. That is why prison ministry is so important, and we should pray and be interested in it. No-one is more vulnerable than those in gaol. It is one of the features of Mothers Union that we have a ministry to the sick and suffering. This reflects the character of the Lord Jesus himself and the work of his Spirit in our hearts.

Question for Thought... How do I love my neighbour as myself?

Gracious God, we pray for our sisters in Glasgow and Galloway in Scotland as they offer support to prisoners and their families and to families affected by domestic abuse and human trafficking. May they have opportunities to share your love and care in the name of Jesus. Amen.

AGENDA

The business of the annual meeting is to include after prayers —

- (a) The minutes of the previous annual meeting and of any subsequent statutory parish meeting;
- (b) The reception of the parish electoral roll;
- (c) The annual report by the vicar that includes the entries in the registers of the Parish for the financial year, including numbers of baptisms, persons received into communicant membership, confirmations, marriages, funerals, Sunday services, acts of communion and such other statistics from the registers as Archbishop in Council determines;
- (d) An annual report on the proceedings of the parish council and together with a report by the parish council on the pastoral care, evangelism, social and ecumenical programmes of the parish and on future plans for the parish; (e) A report by the churchwardens on the fabric, goods and ornaments of the worship centre and the vicarage and other buildings of the parish;
- (f) The audited or independently examined accounts and financial statements of the parish and any accompanying papers required by the Act;
- (g) The budget approved by the parish council for the year in which the meeting is held;
- (h) Reports by other parish groups;
- (i) The election of churchwardens and members of the parish council;
- (j) The election of an auditor or independent examiner;
- (k) The election of lay representatives to the parish incumbency committee;
- (I) Any other matters of parochial or general church interest.
